# Woodland Walk at Arley

# THE WALK

Join us for this popular walk on the Arley Estate near Northwich and help raise funds for Hearing Dogs for Deaf People. The circular route of just over three miles takes in Big Wood, which is not normally open to the public, and the pretty hamlet of Arley Green. There is a great diversity of wild birds in the wood and displays of bluebells and other wild flowers in the spring. Across the Lady Park there are views of the imposing Arley Hall.

This is generally an easy walk, suitable for most people and dogs of average fitness, but not wheelchairs or pushchairs. About two thirds of the route is on hard surfaces but there are sections over bark paths or grass. Walkers must wear suitable clothing and footwear and dogs must be kept on short leads at all times.

- Registration opens at the Stableyard 10.00 am.
- Restaurant, gift shop and toilets.
- Walk starts at 11.00 am and will take about 1½ hours .

# THANK YOU!

Hearing dogs transform the lives of severely or profoundly deaf people by enabling them to live independently. Specially trained hearing dogs can also be placed in families with young deaf children to boost confidence and assist in a deaf child's development.

Hearing dogs are taught to touch when they hear a sound and lead to the source of that sound, for example the doorbell, cooker alarm or a baby's cry. The only sound the dog does not lead to is the smoke alarm, when the dog will touch and then lie down to indicate danger.

From breeding through training until placement with a deaf partner, each one of these amazing dogs, which are given to a deaf person free of charge, costs £25,000. Lifetime support of the partnership costs on average a further £15,000.

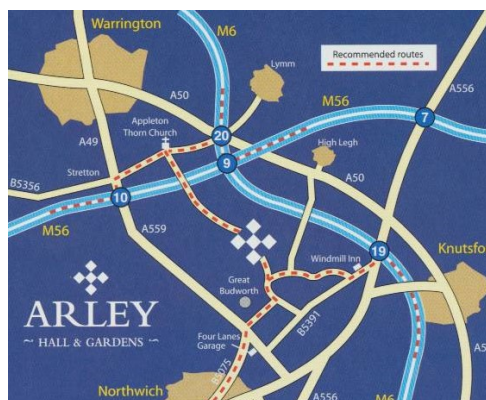
